

PLUNGĖ MANOR ESTATE PLAN

- The Manor Palace. This neo-renaissance palace stands out for its special feature – antique-style sculptures decorating the roof.
- Western building for servants. During the Oginskis' time, this building was used as guest rooms. In 1883, a two-grade Lithuanian school was opened here, and in 1903, M. Oginskienė's secret teachers' school operated in this building.
- Eastern building for servants. It was used by the manor administration, where the accountant worked. This building also had a kitchen.
- Stable. It is a neo-gothic style building in which different breeds of horses were raised, in particular, the Little Samogitian Horse (Žemaitukas) breed was fostered. The chief stableman took care of horses along with his two assistants. There was a coach-house and a drill-hall here.
- Thunder Oak. It is one of the oldest and largest oaks in Lithuania. A beautiful legend is associated with this tree about the maiden Galinda's love and the angry Thunder God, who struck the tree. Since then, the oak has been called Thunder Oak.
- Clock tower – orangery house. It is a 12 metre clock tower with a clock in it, which can be seen from any angle. The clock has only one hand and a bell that rings every hour.
- Park gate and guard's house. This is the main entrance gates to the park with pedestrian gates, also known as the "white gate". To this complex also belongs a guard's house.
- Palace fountain. In the pond at the center of the palace complex, a statue of Venus with Cupids was restored and installed in 1991. In 2019, a dynamic fountain was added, changing the height and shape of the water streams as well as the lighting colors.
- Laundress house. Here, the manor's laundress washed the clothes and bed linen of the dukes and manor residents. There used to be a water pond next to the laundry house.
- Utility gates and pheasant keeper's house. A caretaker of the park's wildlife once lived here. Beside the house stood the red-brick utility gates.
- Monument to M. K. Čiurlionis. It was created based on one of his most famous paintings "Fairy Tale of the Kings".
- Lawyer's house. This is one of the oldest and most beautiful wooden houses in Plungė. It was built in 1910 by M. Oginskienė and gifted to the palace lawyer.
- Roofed pillar for the former music school. A roofed pillar marks the former location of the music school. It was built in 1990 by folk artists J. Majoras and J. Šakinis. The pillar features a carved lyre, and at the top—three brushes and a treble clef—symbolizing the beginning of M. K. Čiurlionis' creative journey in Plungė.
- M. Oginski stable stadium. This stadium hosts show jumping competitions for the Mykolas Oginski festival cup.
- Babrungas river valley. A space for events and recreation in Plungė.
- Monument to B. Lubys. It is dedicated to the signatory of the act of independence of Lithuania, former prime minister, and honorary citizen of Plungė.
- Weeping Linden. On the edge of an eastern pond near the footbridge grows a legendary weeping linden. Despite its damaged trunk, it remains majestic and blooms every year.
- Chapel of the Blessed Virgin Mary of Mercy. This small carved-stone chapel, built in 1845 in front of the Plungė Manor gates, is connected to the Zubov Counts. From the start, it served both the manor and local residents, who would stop to honor the Mother of God—sometimes even sitting on benches to change their shoes before entering or leaving town.

13. Art installation
Dariaus and Girėno St., Plungė

This installation was created to commemorate two anniversaries in 2017: 450 years since Plungė was first mentioned in written sources, and 225 years since the city received Magdeburg rights.




14. Babrungas river waterfall

Before the Babrungas river enters the Plungė manor park, there once stood a mill and a dam. The mill no longer exists, but a waterfall about two meters high remains. A viewing platform has been built nearby, offering an excellent view of the river and the waterfall.




7. St. John the Baptist church
Vytauto St. 34, Plungė
This neo-romanesque church has a Latin cross layout and two towers. Its construction took 31 years and was completed only in 1933. The church is one of the largest in Lithuania, measuring 75 meters in length. The church building complex of the St. John the Baptist also belongs to a bell tower built in the classical style. On the facade of the bell tower you can see the coat of arms with an inscription of its founders, the Counts Zubovs.




8. The building of the old pastorate
Vytauto St. 26, Plungė
The famous Lithuanian painter and composer M. K. Čiurlionis and his wife S. Kymantaitė-Čiurlionienė lived in this pastorate for a period of time. It was the most creative period of their lives. In the summer of 1909, M. K. Čiurlionis produced about 20 paintings. In 1975, to mark the 100th anniversary of the artist's birth, roofed crosses based on Čiurlionis' painting Samogitian crosses were installed in the pastorate yard. A memorial board by sculptor V. Juzickėnas was also unveiled on the building's wall.




9. Chapel of all Saints
Birutės St. 24, Plungė
All saints chapel, also known as the St. John the Baptist chapel or the Zubov chapel, is a catholic chapel located in the old cemetery of Plungė. The brick chapel, built in the romantic classicism style with burial vaults, was constructed in 1858 by local craftsmen with funds from Count Zubov and the parishioners.



10. Lourdes Grotto
Birutės St., Plungė

With M. Oginskienė's donation, land was purchased and a statue of the Virgin Mary was erected in 1905. In 1906, a Lourdes grotto was built on the bank of the Babrungas river and blessed that same year. During the Soviet period, the grotto was destroyed, and the statue of the Virgin Mary was damaged and thrown into the river. The grotto, together with a copy of the original statue, was rebuilt and blessed again in 1990.




11. Plungė "sea" shore trail

This scenic area offers something for everyone. Children can enjoy the playground, teenagers can have fun on the rope trails or use the fitness equipment, and adults can walk along the paths, relax on benches, or admire the views from the observation points. The nearby hill is known to locals as Love Hill. The reservoir itself is affectionately called the Plungė Sea, and its shore provides a peaceful place for a quiet stroll, picnics, or simply enjoying the surrounding nature.



12. Old Town Square

Until 1951, a large building with small Jewish shops, called "kromai", stood on the site of today's Old Town Square. Today, the square features a fountain, a bench dedicated to famous people from the Plungė district, and bronze clogs honoring everyone who loves and respects traditional folk dance.


PLUNGĖ CITY MAP


1. Duke M. Oginski palace / Samogitian art museum
Parko St. 3A, Plungė

The Samogitian art museum is located in one of the most beautiful manor complexes in Lithuania, in the palace of Duke Mykolas Oginski's estate. The manor is surrounded by one of the largest (58.3 ha) and most beautiful mixed-style parks in Lithuania. The exhibitions offer an opportunity to get acquainted with works of professional art from the 20th–21st centuries, which were donated to the museum by Samogitian artists living in Lithuania and abroad. The museum has an exhibition dedicated to the composer M. K. Čiurlionis. Visitors can see a unique exhibit – a piano made by the C. Bechstein company, which was played by the young M. K. Čiurlionis.




2. Clock tower – orangery house / Plungė district municipality public library
Parko St. 7, Plungė
This building is a miniature copy of the Palazzo Vecchio palace in Florence. Its clock features a rare and unique anchor mechanism dating back to 1741. Duke M. Oginski purchased the Plungė Manor from Platonas Zubovas in 1873 and used the clock tower – orangery as a gardener's residence and an orangery. In 2012, following the restoration of the clock tower and reconstruction of the collapsed orangery, the Plungė district municipality public library was established here.



3. Park gate and guard's house (Tourism information center)

The ornate neo-renaissance gates were built in 1879, with columns topped by two bears holding shields with coats of arms. The gate complex also includes the guard's house, which now houses the Plungė tourism information center. Visitors can stop here to get information about the area and buy local products, Lithuanian-themed items, and souvenirs.




4. Monument to M. K. Čiurlionis

This monument by sculptor D. Matulaitė and architect J. Balkevičius was erected in 2018 in the park of the Duke M. Oginski manor. The monument is based on one of M. K. Čiurlionis' most famous paintings, "Fairy Tale of the Kings", which was created in 1909 in Plungė.



5. Laisvės Alley (Freedom avenue) and Independence Monument
Laisvės Ave., Plungė

It is one of the oldest avenues in Lithuania and one of the most interesting and beautiful streets in Plungė. It was designed in the second half of the 19th century by order of Duke M. Oginski. During the interwar period, the avenue remained a prestigious area – it was home to the municipality, post office, telegraph, the first Lithuanian school, the first cinema, a pharmacy, restaurant, library, photo studio, and other institutions. In Laisvės alley stands an impressive monument Independence Monument, it dedicated to the 10th anniversary of Lithuania's independence, completed in 1931.



6. Statue of St. Florian
Vytauto St., Plungė

It is believed that the first St. Florian statue was built in 1894 after a fire that broke out during the St. John's feast. The monument was funded by M. Oginski. During the Soviet period, the monument was demolished, but after Lithuania regained its independence, it was rebuilt and blessed in 1990.



1 Beržoras village

56.025376, 21.812134 (WGS)
Beržoras village first mentioned in the 15th century. It features the wooden St. Stanislovas church (1746) and an old parish cemetery, both among Lithuania's oldest. Fourteen wooden chapels—the Stations of the Cross—were built in 1759–1760, demolished in the 1970s, and now reconstructed. Nearby lies Beržoras lake, covering 52 hectares.



2 Plateliai

Plateliai, first mentioned in the 15th century, moved from the Šventorkalnis peninsula to its current location by the late 17th century. Situated on the western shore of lake Plateliai, the largest and deepest in Samogitia, the town features the wooden St. Peter and Paul church (1744), the Plateliai manor estate with surviving farm buildings, and monuments including the St. Florian chapel column. Plateliai is known for its traditional Užgavėnės (Shrove Tuesday)—celebrations—and has received international recognition: EDEN's most attractive European tourist destination in 2008 and "Best Tourism Village" by the UN World Tourism Organization in 2025.



3 Visitor Center in Plateliai

The exposition "Secrets of the Samogitian Land" is located at Visitor center. Giliukas – the lead character of exposition invites visitors to take a trip through the Samogitian national park to discover its secrets.



4 Plateliai Manor park and Witch's Ash (Raganos ash)

The 6.2 hectare Plateliai manor park began to take shape in the 19th century. It is a mixed park, dominated by landscape-style elements. The pride of the park is the Witch's Ash, the thickest ash tree in Lithuania.



5 Expositions of Samogitian national park and Shrove Tuesday (Užgavėnės)

The exposition includes updated displays on the history of Plateliai manor, local events, and the ethnography of the Samogitian region, as well as an exhibition dedicated to nature. The neighboring stable, built in the second half of the 19th century in the historicist style, houses Lithuania's first exhibition of Shrove Tuesday (Užgavėnės) masks. It showcases more than 300 masks representing the famous traditional festival.



6 Siberija viewing tower

From the 15 meter high tower, you can see lakes Plateliai and Beržoras, the Siberian wetland—one of the most valuable wetlands in Samogitian national park—the village of Beržoras, the southern part of Plateliai town, and Liepijų forest.



7 Plateliai scenic viewpoint

The viewpoint offers beautiful views of the famous lake Plateliai, its islands (Pilies Island and Versių Island), the Šventorkalnis Peninsula, and the dark forests of Plokštinė. It is accessible for people with mobility and visual impairments.



8 Cold War Exhibition

This exhibition is located in a former Soviet Union underground missile launch complex. From 1963 to 1978, four SS-4 medium-range ballistic missiles armed with 2-megaton thermonuclear warheads were stationed here. The former missile and control equipment rooms now house a modern historical exhibition, telling the story of the Cold War, which lasted for five decades.



9 Memorial museum of the writer Žemaitė, Bukantė manor

It is the famous birthplace of Žemaitė, a classic Lithuanian writer born here in 1845. The museum includes a memorial exhibition in her native home, presenting her life and literary works. 9 Leonardas Černiauskas art gallery – creative workshops

Leonardas Černiauskas has bought the water mill, built in 1816 and formerly owned by Count Choiseille. He restored it and established his art gallery and workshops in 1989. Today, it houses a permanent exhibition of his paintings, wood carvings, and antiques.



10 The park of energetic labyrinths and geometric shapes

Set in a beautiful forested area, the park is a true oasis of tranquility. It features five energy labyrinths of varying lengths (54 m to 1,800 m) and purposes, along with other geometric figures such as domes, a mandala, and a merkaba. The labyrinths are shaped and planted with decorative plants, flowers, and medicinal herbs.



11 Žemaičių Kalvarija (Samogitian Calvary)

According to written sources, the city was first mentioned in 1253 and called Gardai. First Road to Calvary (Way of the Cross, Golgotha) with 19 chapels was created by bishop Jurgis Tiškevičius in the thirties of the 17th century in Grand Duchy of Lithuania. He also built the church dedicated to St. Mary, which in 1988 was granted the status of a basilica by Pope John Paul II. Samogitian Calvary is one of the most visited sacred places in Lithuania. Here are intersects pilgrimage routes of St. James and Camino Lituano. In 2022, a new Lourdes grotto was installed and consecrated at Samogitian Calvary.



12 Memorial museum of the writer Žemaitė, Bukantė manor

13 Gandinga mound

Gandinga was historically an important cultural, administrative, and defensive site, first mentioned in the 1253 documents dividing the Curonian lands. Archaeological finds show that this area is unique in Lithuania, with five mounds located within a small area. Today, there is a scenic trail along the Babrunėnai river and around the Gandinga mound. A recently built bridge over the Babrunėnai river allows visitors to reach the nearby Nausodis, Varkaliai mounds as well.



14 Kuliiai

Arriving in the center of Kuliiai, the eye is drawn to the St. Bishop Stanislovas church complex. The church was built in 1900 by Duke M. Ogniski, together with parishioners and priest Vincentas Jarulaitis, following the design of Swedish architect K. Straudman. Kuliiai was once an important center for bookselling. Architectural monuments in the town include a cemetery chapel, a monument to J. Tumas-Vaižgantas in the churchyard, and a Freedom monument near the church gates. Visitors can also see sculptural installations such as Suolelis Sofijai and Vaižgantas' Glasses.



15 Monument to the victims of the Holocaust in Kaušėnai

Near Plungė, in the village of Kaušėnai, there is a hill overgrown with trees where about 1800 Jews from Plungė were killed and buried on July 15–16, 1941. Jacob Bunka, the last Jew of Plungė, together with his friends, Lithuanian woodcarvers, founded the Kaušėnai memorial using oak sculptures. Nearby, the Kaušėnai Saviors' alley was created, and in 2011 the Wall of Remembrance was unveiled, made of 1800 bricks taken from the demolished great synagogue of Plungė.



16 Alsėdžiai

In the town center stands the church of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, built in 1793. Alsėdžiai is also home to the grave of S. Narutavičius, a signatory of the February 16, 1918 Act of Independence, and the birthplace of signatory J. Smilgevičius. The town features a mound called Zverinyčia and hosts the Alsėdžiai Discovery center with various exhibitions.
